## Guidelines for Applying for a Federated Garden Clubs of NYS, Ninth District Scholarship

The applicant must have completed at least one year of an accredited college to be eligible for a 9<sup>th</sup> District scholarship. They must be a legal NYS resident, maintain respectable grades and must be enrolled for the second year. Their course of study should include horticulture, landscape design, botany, conservation, city planning, forestry, environmental sciences, or any other allied field. The student must have a GPA of 3.0 in these courses.

As part of the process the student must submit an official transcript from the school they are attending, a recommendation from their college advisor and a recommendation from someone who has been a part of the students extracurricular activities or community service as it relates to the above courses of study.

The amount of the scholarship awards will range between \$1,000 and \$2,000 depending on the availability of funds and the number of applicants applying for a scholarship during any given year. The awards will be sent to the financial officer at the school they are attending and dispersed from that office. The monies should go toward books or materials that relate to the above courses of study.

The deadline for submissions of the applications are as follows:

Spring Attendance: October 31st

Fall Attendance: March 31<sup>st</sup>
