Procedure for Applying for a Flower Show Achievement Award in the 9th District, FGCNYS, Inc.

Please note 9th District procedures differ from FGCNYS, Inc. and NGC, Inc. procedures.

- 1. At least 8 weeks before a Flower Show, the Club Judges Chair sends a *letter of intent* to apply for an award to the 9th District Awards Chair (Sue Trager: suzy.trager@gmail.com). This may be a letter or an email; a phone call is not sufficient. The *letter of intent* must include:
 - a. Club name
 - b. Mailing address
 - c. Name & contact information for Judges Chair
 - d. Flower Show title, date(s), location & theme
 - e. Names, addresses & emails of all Judges judging the show (contact Judges Council for assistance)
 - f. Intent to apply for a show award, a schedule award, or both
- 2. At least 4-6 weeks before the show, Sue Trager will assign Judges to evaluate either the show, the schedule, or both; depending on the Club's request. *These newly assigned Judges may or may not be the same Judges as the ones who are judging the show.* Sue will send to the Judge's Chair:
 - a. The names of the Judges on the evaluating panel(s)
 - b. The NGC Standard Flower Show Achievement Award Application form, &
 - c. The NGC Standard Flower Show Achievement Award Show Data form
- 3. Each evaluating panel will consist of 3 Judges. One panel will evaluate the show and/or a second panel will evaluate the schedule. These panels may or may not be the same Judges who are judging the exhibits in the show. Accredited Judges (not Student Judges, Accredited Life Judges or Accredited Master Judges) may receive an alternate credit for evaluating a show, but they may not count this credit if they are already counting the credit for judging the exhibits in the show. (TNG Winter 2019 pg. 35)
- 4. Some panel possibilities:
 - a. Panel A: judge show & evaluate show OR evaluate schedule
 - b. Panel B: judge show & evaluate schedule OR evaluate show
 - c. Panel C: judge show ONLY
 - d. Panel D: judge show ONLY
 - e. Panel E: evaluate show ONLY
 - f. Panel F: evaluate schedule ONLY via mail
 - g. Accredited Judges evaluate show ONLY & receive alternate credit
- 5. The Club is responsible for providing the appropriate evaluating forms to each evaluating Judge along with a stamped addressed envelope addressed to the District Awards Chair, Sue Trager at 48 Rocky Ridge Cortlandt Manor NY 10567-6530. Evaluating forms were provided in the President's Pack and may be found on the NGC website at http://www.gardenclub.org/schools/fss-forms.aspx. Relevant forms: a. For evaluating a Schedule Form 29
 - b. For evaluating a Standard or a Small Standard Flower Show Form 30S
 - c. For evaluating a Design Specialty Show Form 30D
 - d. For evaluating a Horticulture Specialty Show Form 30H
- For preparing a Book of Evidence (BOE) follow up with the NGC Flower Show Achievement Award Checklist & the NGC Flower Show Achievement Awards found at gardenclub.org.
